
FCHS is a comprehensive, rural high school located in southeast Indiana. We offer a variety of course electives in addition to our core curriculum. Our 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> grade students have the option to attend a nearby career center where they can pursue 14 fields for ½ of the school day. Most of the career center fields have dual credit options. Our seniors also have the option to be in an internship program to receive real work experience.

This is the 33<sup>rd</sup> year for Franklin County High School (FCHS). The school is the result of the consolidation of the former Brookville and Laurel High Schools in 1989. The year began with 734 students in the grades 9-12. The Class of 2023 started the year with 177 seniors.

The school corporation is quite large, covering approximately 305 of the 397 square miles in Franklin County. It is largely a rural area with Brookville (population 3000) being the county seat and largest community. The school corporation has a resident population of approximately 20,000 people.

Many school patrons work in neighboring communities such as Connersville, Richmond, Batesville, Rushville, and Lawrenceburg in Indiana and Oxford, Hamilton, and the greater Cincinnati Metropolitan area in Ohio. The southeast corner of our school corporation is only 20 miles from downtown Cincinnati. Brookville has several moderate size industries, manufacturing goods such as fiberglass roofing, plastic fittings, and packaging materials. Agriculture retains an important role in the life of the school community.

The high school retains the North Central membership that has been held by Brookville since 1926. The staff consists of 50 teaching faculty, two School Counselors, one College & Career Readiness Coordinator, and four Administrators. We utilize teacher's aides and other support staff.

## Excellence is our Expectation!

#### Academic Protocol:

The school year is set up on the semester system with four, nine-week grading periods. We have seven periods in a day. We use the standard A, B, C, D, and F grading system. We require 40 credits for graduation with all graduates required to have eight semesters of English, four semesters of math, science and social studies as a minimum. We also require one semester of health and one year of Physical Education. All students are encouraged to pursue Academic or Technical Honors; Core 40 is the desired minimum diploma for an FCHS graduate.

FCHS operates on a 4-point grading system. GPA is determined according to the following values: A+=4.33; A=4.0; A-=3.67; B+=3.33; B=3.0; B-=2.67; C+=2.33; C=2.0; C-=1.67; D+=1.33; D=1.0; D-=.67; and F=0. The 4.33 figure was added for the 1996-97 school year. Grades made in prior years have not been changed. The addition of weighted courses beginning with the class of 1999 may cause a few GPA's to rise above the 4.33 figure.

The class of 2023 had 32% receive Academic Honors 7% receive Technical Honors, 51% had Core 40 Diplomas, and 10% received general diplomas. We also had 3 students graduate with an Associate's Degree, and 24 with the Indiana College Core certificate (one year of college credits).
